

SafeFutures Youth Center is a non-profit organization that was founded in 1996 by the City of Seattle Human Services Department to provide assistance to at-risk Southeast Asian youth and their families. The organization received its IRS 501c3 status in June 1999 and expanded its services to serve a broader community, including East African, African American, Native American/Alaskan Native, Latino, Pacific Islander, and other populations.

SafeFutures Youth Center is dedicated to providing a safe and supportive environment for young people to learn, grow, and thrive. The organization offers a wide range of services, including academic support, job training, personalized mentorship, and recreational activities. SafeFutures is committed to helping young people build a better future for themselves and their communities.

Summer Youth Internship:

We offer a six-week summer program for 20 applicants, providing career exploration, skill development, field trips, guest speakers, and a \$1000 stipend upon completion. Eligible ages: 14-18.

Personalized Mentorship:

Youth Development Navigators provide personalized support to help young individuals set goals, overcome challenges, and unlock their full potential. They focus on building strong relationships and offer emotional support, personal development tools, academic guidance, and career advice. Despite not being licensed professionals, they stay updated on the latest practices and work closely with partners to ensure youth receive the support they need.

Summer Youth Internship:

At SafeFutures, we provide a safe and supportive environment for young people to explore, learn, and grow. Our workshops and series help them develop new skills, make friends, and discover community opportunities. We tailor programs based on survey data and offer stipends to recognize participant contributions.
